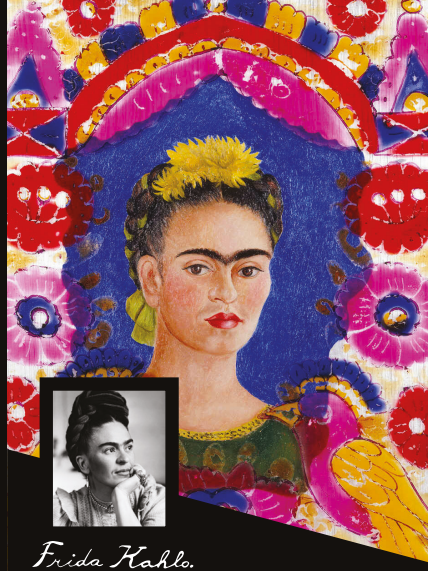

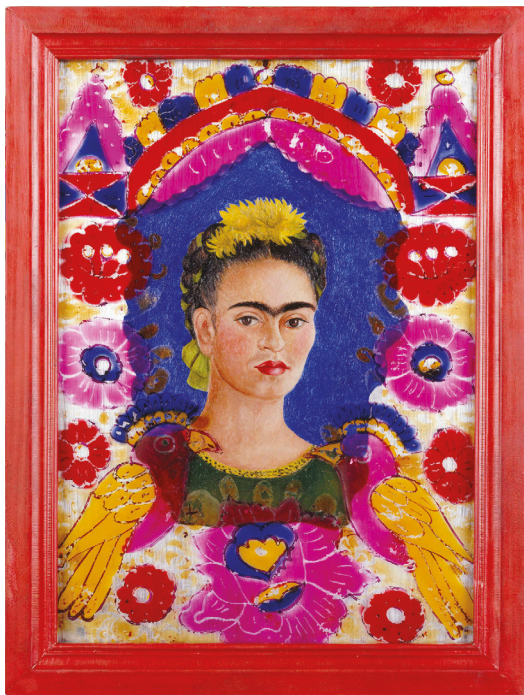

## How does Frida Kahlo's *The Frame* inspire you?

**F**rida Kahlo was a Mexican painter renowned for her powerful and introspective self-portraits. In this painting, the self portrait and blue background are painted on a sheet of aluminum while the border of birds and flowers is painted on the back side of a piece of glass. In 1939, the Louvre bought this painting, making it the first work by a 20th-century Mexican artist to be purchased by an internationally renowned museum.

Suffering from polio as a child and nearly dying in a bus accident as a teenager, Kahlo channeled her pain and experiences



into painting. Life experience is a common theme in her work as an artist. She incorporated macabre scenes of herself, animals, and traditional Mexican attire to express her pain, resilience, and cultural heritage. Her paintings are characterized by vibrant colors and symbolic elements that mixed realism with fantasy.

Kahlo's work continues to resonate with audiences worldwide, seeking to find strength and beauty in their own struggles. Her life and work continue to inspire generations, making her one of the most celebrated and influential artists of the 20th century.
